PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2015

The MUFC is an incorporated association, is an affiliated club of the Melbourne University Sports Association, operates under the auspices of Melbourne University Sport within the University of Melbourne and proudly wears the colours of the University's sporting teams: black and royal blue.

The Club (which was formed in 1859 and only six years after the establishment of the University) is an Australian Rules football club engaged in competitive sport, has participated in the Victorian Football League (now the Australian Football League), and participates in the Victorian Amateur Football Association, the Victorian Women's Football State League, the Victorian Women's Football League and the Essendon & District Football League. The affairs of the Club are regulated by the Rules of the MUFC. A Board of Management (of twelve and, by convention, four from each of the MUWFC, Blues and Blacks) is responsible for the management of the affairs of the Club.

For the best part of one hundred the Club has been represented by University Blacks and University Blues, sometimes quarrelling but always brothers in the Pavilion one standing to the equal of the other regardless of the grade or division in which they play. In 2016, the Club comprises one fifth of the VAFA Premier Division Competition.

For twenty years, the University has been represented by the Melbourne University Women's Football Club. In late 2015, a momentous event occurred when the MUWFC and the MUFC joined forces and the MUWFC was welcomed into the MUFC on a proud day for the MUFC and for University football. In 2016, the MUWFC will field teams in the State League (the premier women's football competition in Australia), the VWFL and (with our youth girls) in the EDFL. MUWFC President, Laura Kane; Vice-President, Karina Russo; Head Junior Coach, Bridget Barker and Senior Official, Sonja Hood have joined the Board of Management of the MUFC. To provide insight into the operations of the MUFC, we have published extracts from the MUWFC 2015 Annual Report.

For almost forty years, the Club was represented with distinction by University Reds now Fitzroy.

For the purpose of remembrance and in appreciation of all the men and women of the University who served Australia in wartime and as a whole of football club event, on 23rd April, 2016 Blues and Blacks will play each other for premiership points in an ANZAC Commemorative Match at the University Oval.

The MUFC has a long history of engaging players from the city, the country, interstate students, graduates and the occasional international student seeking to experience our unique game. We provide an important opportunity for students from the country or city to integrate into the life of the University of Melbourne.

The MUFC provides an opportunity for all levels of skills and enthusiasm to combine athletic endeavour with study or post-university work. The connections players make at MUFC extend into career advancement well past his or her playing days.

In 2015 Blacks fielded three senior teams and an U19 team. Blues fielded three senior teams and two U19 teams. In season 2015 MUFC through the Blacks and the Blues formed one fifth of Premier A Division of the VAFA. Whilst Blues and Blacks are fierce rivals in recent years co-operation and co-ordination between the two "tribes" over ground and asset management together with scheduling of games has resulted in great success for both teams.

The MUFC has a constant source of young talented footballers from its Under 19's teams. Congratulations and thanks to Brad Copeland (Blacks) and Jeff Scotland (Blues) for their management, coaching and guidance of the new Under 19 players who come to MUFC. The role of coach of Under 19 teams at the University is a difficult task and Brad and Jeff have done a great job.

I congratulate Blues as the only club in the VAFA Premier Division to have Seniors and Reserves participating in the finals and to Blues' Reserves for making the Grand Final.

I congratulate the players who represented the Victorian Amateur Football Association in 2015: Alistair Robbins, Jeremy Mugavin, Joel Ernest, Jordan Quaile, Marshall Rippon, Sean Carr, Tom Quinn and Will Blakey. It is a great achievement for each of these players to represent the competition at the highest level.

Although the team representing the University at Australian University Games is not wholly comprised of MUFC footballers, the MUFC, in close collaboration with and greatly assisted by Melbourne University Sport, assumes general responsibility for the organisation, participation and development of football at the University of Melbourne which includes fielding a team at the Australian University Games.

In 2015 on the Gold Coast at the AUG, our team acquitted themselves well going down in the final to the University of Western Australia. I congratulate Thomas Sharp and Lachie Borthwick on being awarded a full blue and Cameron Williams, Hugo Steinfort and Scott Braithwaite on being awarded a half blue. I thank coach, John Kanis, and team manager, Hugo Steinfort, for their efforts in coaching and managing the team.

I thank the committees of Blacks and Blues for their hard work during the year. The day to day operations of the respective teams take a great deal of effort and dedication. The respective committees have performed their tasks very well. In particular I thank Lucas van Kempen (Blacks' Chairman) and Joseph Sturrock (Blues' Chairman) for their active participation in co-operative co-ordination to achieve the best for Blacks and Blues. In particular, LVK has given three years as dedicated leadership as Blacks' chairman, and I thank him for it. I also thank the operations managers at Blues (David Phefley) and Blacks (Rod McLean) whose efforts keep the wheels of University football turning.

I thank the members of the Board for their work, advice and wisdom over the last year. In particular I express my gratitude to Andrew Henderson for his great assistance as General Secretary and Stephen Longley for his unheralded and thorough work as Treasurer and Public Officer but for which this club simply would not comply with its regulatory obligations.

Finally, the Board of the Melbourne University Football Club regards it as a privilege to be charged with the responsibility for the overall management and operation of the MUFC.

1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 101: Presentation of Financial Statements

AASB 107: Cash Flow Statements

AASB 108: Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

AASB 110: Events after the Balance Sheet Date

AASB 116: Property, Plant and Equipment

AASB 117: Leases

AASB 118: Revenue

AASB 1031: Materiality

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Revenue recognition

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Amounts disclosed as trade revenue are net of any returns or trade allowances.

(b) Inventory

Inventories purchased for sale in the current year, including merchandise and sporting equipment, are expensed as acquired. Inventories expected to be carried and sold over future years, such as books, are capitalised as acquired.

(c) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash includes cash on hand, money market deposits which have a maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition, which are readily convertible to cash on hand and are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

(d) **GST**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, unless the GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority. In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of the acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority, are presented as operating cash flows.

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

TO THE MEMBERS OF

MELBOURNE UNIVERSITY FOOTBALL CLUB

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Melbourne University Football Club, which comprises of the balance sheet as at 31 October 2015, the income statement, statement of recognised income and expense, and cash flow statement for the year then ended, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Committee members' Responsibility for the Financial Report

The Committee Members of the entity are responsible for the preparation of the financial report, and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1, is appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act Victoria and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

The Committee member's responsibility also includes such internal control as the Committee members determine is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. These Auditing Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Committee members, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

Independence

In conducting our audit, we have complied with the independence requirements of the Australian professional accounting bodies.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Cash donations, fundraising events and social functions and are a significant source of revenue for the Melbourne University Football Club. The Melbourne University Football Club has determined that it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of these sources of revenue prior to entry into its financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us regarding revenue from this source was limited, our audit procedures with respect to identified sources of voluntary revenue had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. We therefore are unable to express an opinion whether these sources of voluntary revenue the Melbourne University Football Club obtained are complete.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects on the financial report of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Melbourne University Football Club, as of 31 October 2015, and its financial performance, and its cash flows, for the year then ended, in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements.

Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the directors' financial reporting responsibilities under the *Corporations Act 2001*. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

The Seniors had a slow start to the season losing their first 4 games, but they remained persistent and after 11 rounds they had won 6 and lost 5. However across an unprecedented period where the VAFA scheduled a double bye for the competition, the Senior group lost four consecutive matches and found themselves in contention for both the finals and relegation. A win and a loss followed, which consolidated our position in the middle of the table but meant that the finals were now out of reach.

The Blacks hosted Old Collegians in the final round at home and made history in support of the cause, 'Gay, that's OK'. This initiative was developed by club Life Members Lachlan and Charles Beaton and saw the players run out and play in Rainbow coloured jumpers, with the aim of raising awareness and acceptance of gay people in the community.

Another community-based initiative was lead by another member of the club and senior player, Simon Hogan. He combined with a number of players from VAFA clubs to launch the Thick and Thin Initiative, which is designed to raise awareness for mental health among men. Many more players, officials and supporters contributed to a wide range of activity around the club, including:

- Adam Pitt lead the Social Committee that engaged in some great events;
- Darren Collopy lead our relationship with Ladder;
- Millie Lacey continued to rally club supporters to ensure the Blacks' Afternoon Tea was still the best in the business;
- The Black Spot continued to make us laugh at the Clyde;
- Andrew (Rusty) Else, Dave Batten, Wil Davidson and Jeremy Hill entertained with a range of club communication platforms;
- Tom Napier led the crew behind the bar kept us hydrated as we really started to feel more at home in the new Pavvy;
- Dan Costello lead an industry leading study into the affects of concussion on footballers;
- Heather Lacey and Dr.David Russell were honoured as recipients of the Andy Smith Best Club Person award;

- We celebrated 3 Premiership Reunions, had a big Breakfast to start the Season and a cracking Golf Day, thanks to Nick Carah, Rod McLean and Ray Wilson;
- Andy Smith completed his 53rd consecutive year as a volunteer
- Peter Keogh completed his 23rd year as the club's allocated umpire to the Reserves competition and continues to donate his payments to the club
- An Argentinean student called Ignacio Lopez Basa-vil-Baso became a cult hero after taking up the game of Aussie Rules and finished up polling votes in the Reserves.

The Blacks have widely been known for our inclusiveness and with 149 players representing the club in 2015 there is no wonder why it is a trait of our club. New registrations totalled 73 for the season, with 75 players from 2015 not playing for the club in 2015. Of the 73 new registrations, 43 were senior players and 32 were Under 19 players. The Seniors played 43 players, the Reserves played 50, the Thirds or Phoenix played 69 and the Under 19 Team played 37 for the season.

The Seniors welcomed 11 new players in 2015, the standouts being Mathew O'Brien (18 games) and Lewis O'Brien (11 games), no relation, while Charlie Richardson returned to the club to again perform consistently across his 16 games. But unfortunately 6 Premiership Players from 2104 left the club.

The Reserves lost 16 players from their 2014 playing list, the Thirds lost 33 players while the Under 19s turned over 30 players from the season before. In season 2015, the club won 34% of all games played. In 2014 this figure was 64% and in 2013 it was 55%.

While injuries did play a part in the performance of our teams over the season, the players were in good hands with Dr Tony Costello and Dr David Russell acting as Club Doctors. Pat Arnold and Rob Osbourne headed up the Physio and Trainers team with Kieser Training again sponsoring the club in 2016. Bendigo Private Banking Services remained as the Major Sponsor of the Club, with the Clyde Hotel, Moama Bowling Club, Flight Centre Armadale and Dinamic all continuing to support the club financially in 2015. Of course the club would like to acknowledge the support that MU Sport provides through the provision of outstanding facilities and services.

We also thank the MUFC Board for their support and congratulate Blacks' clubman Andrew Donald who was appointed as President in 2015. Congratulations to Andrew for also organising a very fitting ANZAC Ceremony ahead of the Blacks v Blues Derby on ANZAC Day.

From a committee perspective, a dedicated group of people drove the operations of the club through the designated areas of Governance, Finance, Engagement, Communications and Football.

Thanks to Sam Lane, Peter Mill, Darren Collopy, Rob Hanna and Andrew Else who made up the Committee this season, with special acknowledgement to our office bearers; Rod McLean – Operations Manager, Andrew Torney – Treasurer, Scott Myers – Secretary and Nick Carah – as Deputy and now the incoming Chairperson.

Congratulations to Huw and Millie Lacey who both left the committee at different stages throughout the season after both serving for a number of years.

Thank you goes to Peter MacDonald for the compilation of the information that is contained in this Report. Peter keeps all of the club records he and his wife also ran the club canteen over course of the season.

This year ends my third and last year as Club Chairman. Thanks to all at the club who have supported me in this role and I look forward to continuing on the Committee in 2016.

In season 2015, University Blues was the only club in Premier A division to have both Senior and Reserve teams play in finals. This is something that Blues can be extremely proud of and something that would have felt almost impossible at the end of the 2013 season when the Club was relegated to Premier B. Nevertheless the changes made both on and off the field during this time have allowed the club to set a platform to build on to ensure continued success.

The coaching team headed by Senior Coach Quinton Gleeson and Reserves Coach Christian Neeson, can take great pride in what they have developed within the playing group this year which has resulted in Blues once again being a force in Premier division.

I would like to make special mention of the dedication and commitment shown by Quinton throughout the season. While not taking away from the work done by our wonderful coaching group as a whole, much of the club's turnaround in fortunes over the past two seasons can be credited to the work done by Quinton. It was great to welcome Christian 'Doc' Neeson to the Blues in 2015 and we are a better club for him being here. A couple of months into preseason and it was like Doc had been here all his life. His football knowledge and understanding of the VAFA were enjoyed by all at the club, not just the Reserves. And a grand final appearance in his first season sets the bar pretty high!

The senior coaching group in 2015 was rounded out by James Walker and another first year "Blue" in Ben McKinley. Both with AFL experience and so much to offer, our playing group benefited no end from their coaching. Notably, James continued his match day work with the Reserves as well as the Seniors, helping Doc with a consistent message across the group. Ben's insights and unwavering commitment ensured that he will be a valuable member of the coaching group in 2016.

Our Thirds' team probably suffered the most during our early season injury woes and try as he might, coach Luke Fulton struggled to embed any consistency in the side with upwards of eight changes a week in the first half of the year. The Thirds finished in 8th spot with four wins and 10 losses but showed remarkable spirit towards the end of the year. Luke has indicated that he will not be taking up the Thirds coaching role in 2016 and as a Club we are sorry to see him go but wish him all the very best in his future coaching and football pursuits.

Our Under 19 and Colts teams had an up and down year. The Unders finished out of finals contention in 6th position with eight wins, nine losses and a draw, while our Colts team, having a much improved performance in their second year of existence, finished just outside the finals in 5th with eight wins - six more than last year.

In 2015, more so than in previous years, the Unders and Colts were decimated during the university holiday period and it was during this time that their respective finals aspirations took a hit. As a Club we have learned from this and will be looking at implementing measures to attempt to lessen the impacts of this in future seasons. The Blues are grateful for the time and effort put in by our fantastic Under 19 and Colts coaching staff of Jeff Scotland, Jason Evans and Will Langley who do an amazing job with limited resources. And once again the Blues are indebted to Bob Girdwood who stood in as interim Under 19 coach during the middle of the season.

Over the length of the season, a total of 184 players pulled on a Blues jumper which, quite simply is an amazing figure.

VOLUNTEERS

I would like to thank the Executive Committee for their behind the scenes work during the year, often having to juggle work and family commitments to help out the Blues. To Tom Hutchins (Vice Chairman), David Phefley (Football Operations), John Kanis (Football Operations and Coaching), George de Crespigny (Blues Alumni), Andrew Wilson (Commercial), Stephen Meade (Club Secretary), Chris Reid (Communications), Will Hartnell (Player representative) and Hugh Vickers-Willis (Finance), the Club really appreciates the time and effort they dedicated to the Uni Blues this year.

Once again the work and dedication shown by our Football and Administration Manager, David Phefley, is unparalleled in the VAFA. The passion shown by David in everything he does around the club is evident with even the smallest tasks never being too much of a problem. The club showed its appreciation by awarding David the Chris Brown award for 2015 which saw him become only the second member of the Blues Community to be a dual recipient of the award, following in the footsteps of Michael "Bomber" Thomas. This year we were lucky enough to have Edgar Guerrero volunteer his services in our Football Administration department and Edgar provided great support to David and all our volunteers. We hope to see Edgar back around the Club in 2016.

Recognition and thanks also needs to be given to our wonderful match day team managers whose position description is loosely defined as "anything that needs to be done for the team on a Saturday." Thank you to Michael Robin and Tony McInerney (Seniors), Gerry Westmore and John Carmody (Reserves), Josh Tinner (Thirds), Bernie Angel (Under 19) and Tom Morrison and Elliot Cartledge (Colts).

As always the "Thursday Night Crew" did a sterling job this season and with the addition of the chicken parma to the menu, they ensured that all the boys were well fed with a variety of dishes throughout the season. Thank you very much Tony McInerney, Gerry Westmore, John Carmody, Jon Van de Pol, Bernie Angel and new recruit Peter Sturrock. It is a great tradition and long may it continue.

Speaking of great traditions, there are few as long standing and as special as our half time afternoon teas! Once again afternoon teas in the Pavvy were a feature of Blues' home games and while the players did a great job in providing a variety of culinary delights, it was the hard work done behind the scenes by Helen Phefley and Karin Heinz that really made our arvo teas something not to be missed.

MEDICAL TEAM

There is no doubt in my mind that we had far and away the best medical team and set up in the VAFA. Step Back Think works to educate thousands of students each year on the consequences of a violent decision made in a split second and we at the Blues look forward to continuing our partnership in the years to come.

LUNCHEES AND OTHER SOCIAL EVENTS

2015 continued to be a very successful year socially as the Blues hosted two well-attended match day lunches as well as the Blues Business Breakfast and annual Ball and Auction Night.

The Business Breakfast looks to have cemented itself as a not to miss event on the social calendar. The breakfast was once again expertly hosted by James Dunn at the RACV Club and our guest speaker, Sir Rod Eddington (AO), ensured all that were in attendance enjoyed themselves and left wanting to hear more. After the success of the inaugural breakfast, I didn't think that it would be possible for me to say that it was even better in the second year, but it was. Thanks to Tom Hutchins and Chris Maxwell for their work in ensuring that the breakfast was a success.

Once again our annual Ball and Auction night was not only a great success as a social occasion for the Blues community but it continues to raise much needed funds for our football club.
