## **PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2019**

The MUFC is an incorporated association, is an affiliated club of the Melbourne University Sports Association, operates under the auspices of Melbourne University Sport within the University of Melbourne and proudly wears the colours of the University's sporting teams: black and royal blue. The activities of the MUFC are founded upon meticulous planning, thorough preparation and the ethos of hard work. The core beliefs of leadership, responsibility, contribution, cohesion and teamwork (whilst making the MUFC a happy and supportive place in which to be involved with football) that each has imbued into the lives of many are the core beliefs of this football club and our three great tribes.

The Club (which was formed in 1859 and only six years after the establishment of the University) is an Australian Rules football club engaged in competitive sport, has participated in the Victorian Football League (now the Australian Football League), and, in 2019, participated in the Victorian Football League, the Victorian Amateur Football Association, the Western Region Football League. The affairs of the Club are regulated by the Rules of the MUFC. A Board of Management (of twelve and, by convention, four from each of the MUWFC, Blues and Blacks) is responsible for the management of the affairs of the Club.

For the best part of one hundred years, the Club has been represented in men's football by University Blacks and University Blues, sometimes quarrelling but always brothers in the Pavilion one standing to the equal of the other regardless of the grade or division in which they play. For twenty years, the University has been represented in women's football by the Melbourne University Women's Football Club which now exists as a standing committee of the Club. For almost forty years, the Club was represented with distinction by University Reds now Fitzroy.

The MUFC has a long history of engaging players from the city, the country, interstate students, graduates and the occasional international student seeking to experience our unique game. We provide an important opportunity for students from the country or city to integrate into the life of the University of Melbourne. The MUFC provides an opportunity for all levels of skills and enthusiasm to combine athletic endeavour with study or post-university work. The connections players make at MUFC extend into career advancement well past her or his playing days.

In 2019, Blacks celebrated Indigenous Round in May in their game v Old Geelong which has become a very important part of the Blacks' calendar. In addition, Blacks hosted a moving viewing with over 100 players and supporters of "The Australian Dream" at the Nova Cinema, Carlton courtesy of past player and executive producer, Paul Wiegard from Madman Entertainment.

In 2019, the MUWFC fielded three senior teams and an Under 18 youth girls' team in the Victorian Football League Women's League (Senior Grade), the Victorian Amateur Football Association (Premier Division and Premier Reserves Division) and the Western Region Football League (Under 18 Youth Girls).

In 2019 in Premier A Division, Blues fielded three senior teams and, in Under 19 Section 1, an Under 19 team.

In 2019, in Premier B Division, Blacks fielded three senior teams and, in Under 19 Section 1, an Under 19 team.

The undoubted highlight of the season was Blues' thoroughly deserved, well-planned and well-executed premiership in Premier Division in the Senior Grade. Blues' Reserve Grade finished fourth before being defeated in the First-Semi Final.

The MUWFC Senior Grade had a fine season in the VFLW finishing sixth and playing in tow finals. The Mugar's Premier Women's Reserve Grade team had a marvellous season finishing runners-up.

Blacks' Senior Grade also had a fine season and, for the second year in a row, were narrowly beaten (by less than a goal) in the VAF A Premier B Preliminary Final. Blacks' Reserve Grade were runners up having also had a fine season.

The MUFC has a constant source of young talented footballers from our Under 18 and Under 19's teams. Thanks to our coaches for their management, coaching and guidance of the Under 18 and Under 19 players who represented the MUFC. The role of coach of Under 18 and Under 19 University teams is arduous and time-consuming and our younger players have been the fortunate beneficiaries of the hard work, mentoring and leadership of our coaches.

Whilst Blues and Blacks are fierce rivals, recent years have seen co-operation and co-ordination between the two "tribes" over ground and asset management together with scheduling of games. This has been greatly assisted by the MUWFC who continue to develop strong relations with each of Blacks and Blues.

I congratulate Emma Kearney, Jasmine Garner, Monique Conti, Madison Prespakis and Gabbie Pound upon their selection in the 2019 AFLW All Australian Team. I congratulate Jenna Bruton, Jasmine Garner, Kate Gillespie-Jones, Ashleigh Riddell and former player, Monique Conti (Richmond) on their selection in the 2019 VFLW Team of the Year.

I congratulate Ayce Cordy on his richly deserved win of the JN Woodrow Medal for the best and fairest in the VAF A Premier Division (going back to back) together with his selection in the VAF A Team of the Year. I congratulate Marshall Rippon, Ben Capra, Cam O'Shea, Josh Green on their selection in the team and Blues' senior coach, Heath Jamieson, as coach of the team.

I congratulate Josh Steadman (c), Daniel McCullogh and Jarrod Carlson on their selection in the VAF A Premier B Team of the Year.

I thank our senior captains, Emma Kearney (MUWFC), Ayce Cordy (Blues) and Jordan Quaile and Josh Steadman (Blacks) for their strong on and off-field leadership. The MUFC is indeed fortunate to have leaders of the calibre of Emma, Ayce, Jordan and Josh.

#### 1. STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 101: Presentation of Financial Statements

AASB 107: Cash Flow Statements

AASB 108: Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors

AASB 1048: Interpretation of Standards

AASB 1054: Australian Additional Disclosures

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

#### **New or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted**

The incorporated association has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

#### *Impact of adoption*

AASB 15, AASB 16 and AASB 1058 were adopted using the modified retrospective approach and as such comparatives have not been restated. There was no impact on opening retained profits as at 1 November 2019.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### **(a) Revenue recognition**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable. Amounts disclosed as trade revenue are net of any returns or trade allowances.

**(b) Inventory**

Inventories purchased for sale in the current year, including merchandise and sporting equipment, are expensed as acquired. Inventories expected to be carried and sold over future years, such as books, are capitalised as acquired.

**(c) Cash and cash equivalents**

Cash includes cash on hand, money market deposits which have a maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition, which are readily convertible to cash on hand and are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

**(d) GST**

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, unless the GST incurred is not recoverable from the taxation authority. In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of the acquisition of the asset or as part of the expense.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is included with other receivables or payables in the balance sheet.

Cash flows are presented on a gross basis. The GST components of cash flows arising from investing or financing activities which are recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority, are presented as operating cash flows.

## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT To the Members of Melbourne University Football Club

### Opinion

We have audited the financial report of Melbourne University Football Club, which comprises the statement of financial position as at 31 October 2019, the statement of comprehensive income, the statement of changes in equity and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and other explanatory information.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial report presents fairly, in all material respects the financial position of Melbourne University Football Club as at 31 October 2019, and its performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements.

### Committee member's Responsibility for the Financial Report

The Committee Members of the entity are responsible for the preparation of the financial report, and have determined that the basis of preparation described in Note 1, is appropriate to meet the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012* Victoria and is appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

The Committee member's responsibility also includes such internal control as the Committee members determine is necessary to enable the preparation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

### Basis for Qualified Opinion

Cash donations, fundraising events and social functions and are a significant source of revenue for the Melbourne University Football Club. The Melbourne University Football Club has determined that it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of these sources of revenue prior to entry into its financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us regarding revenue from this source was limited, our audit procedures with respect to identified sources of voluntary revenue had to be restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. We therefore are unable to express an opinion whether these sources of voluntary revenue the Melbourne University Football Club obtained are complete.

### Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects on the financial report of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Melbourne University Football Club, as of 31 October 2019, and its financial performance, and its cash flows, for the year then ended, in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements.

### **Basis of Accounting**

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the directors financial reporting responsibilities. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report**

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial report as a whole is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance, but is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with the Australian Auditing Standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of this financial report.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Committee members, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

## **WOMEN'S – PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

In 2019, the Melbourne University Women's Football Club proudly continued to provide the opportunity for women and girls to play Australian Rules football.

MUWFC entered three senior women's teams, including in the VFL Women's, VAFA Premier and Premier Reserves competitions, along with one junior girls team in the WRFL U18 Youth Girls competition.

2019 would prove to be a significant year of change for the MUWFC.

### **VFL Women's**

2019 would prove to be very successful for our VFLW – both on and off the field.

MUWFC proudly hosted the Darebin Falcons at home ground Main Oval, for the annual Pride game between our clubs. The game and luncheon event was a wonderful success, with guest speakers including AFL General Manager of Inclusion, Social Policy Tanya Hosch and Gender and Sexuality Commission Ro Allan and our very own Emma Kearney. We wish to thank Vice Chancellor Professor Duncan Maskell and Melbourne University Sport for their unwavering support and passionate commitment to equality.

Following finishing 6<sup>th</sup> after the home and away season, our VFLW recorded a good win over the Geelong Cats in week 1 of finals, but would eventually fall short, losing by 17 points to the Southern Saints the following week.

We congratulate captain Emma Kearney for her leadership efforts this year.

We congratulate Michelle Dench Best and Fairest winner Kate Gillespie-Jones.

We congratulate Jenna Bruton, Jasmin Garner, Kate Gillespie-Jones and Ash Riddell on their selection into the 2019 VFL Women's Team of the Year.

We continued to support a strong community partnership with the North Melbourne Football Club. That partnership was ended at the conclusion of the 2019 season, with NMFC opting to go standalone in the VFLW for 2020. The decade long partnership is one that both clubs are incredibly proud of.

### **VAFA**

#### ***Premier***

After the high of a grand final win in 2018, the 2019 season proved difficult for our VAFA Premier division. Personal circumstances for our coaches and movement of players to other VFL sides were a large contributor to the challenges faced by the side. Highlights of the season included the two final games in which we were victorious, and lifted us from the bottom of the ladder, to second last. Season 2019 bore a remarkable similarity to the previous season, with the Uni Blacks performing admirably only to fall agonizingly short again in the Preliminary Final, going down to Old Scotch by 5 points.

After the heartbreak of our last kick of the day loss in the 2018 Preliminary Final, we entered the season full of resolve and hope but despite a 14:4 season and with a percentage of 184.97%, we finished the season 3<sup>rd</sup> behind Caulfield Grammarians and Old Scotch who both had 16:2 seasons.

The unbalanced nature of Premier B has proven to be a major challenge over the past two seasons, with too many lopsided results. Beaumaris who finished 4<sup>th</sup> in 2019, were a full 5 games behind the Blacks.

## **Football**

At the end of the home and away season, Caulfield Grammarians had earned top spot with just 2 losses, having beaten Blacks in both games, with Old Scotch in second place, also with just the 2 losses, leaving Blacks in third place with 4 losses and Beaumaris back in fourth position with 9 losses.

The First Semi Final played at the Box Hill City Oval in very wet and windy conditions the Blacks easily accounted for Beaumaris and ran out comfortable winners 14.13.97 to 2.3.15. The only downside was a worrying concussion to reigning Cordner Medalist, Jarrod Carlson.

The following week the Blacks took on Old Scotch in the Preliminary Final and it was another classic encounter. Scotch jumped the Blacks and playing a hard running and aggressive brand of football, cleared out to a 21 point lead at half time. During the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter the lead got out to 33 points until the Blacks led by co-captains, Jordan Quaile and Josh Steadman willed themselves back into the contest. Despite coming home like a steam train, the Blacks just couldn't hit the front and once again fell agonizingly short of returning to Premier Division, going down by 5 points.

The Reserves had another very successful backing up their Grand Final appearance in 2018, by winning 15 games and finishing the H & A season in second place on the ladder. They went down to the undefeated ladder leaders Old Scotch in the second Semi Final by 45 points but comfortably won the Preliminary Final against Old Geelong by 40 points. We faced Old Scotch again for the 4<sup>th</sup> time in 2019 in Grand Final, but once again they were too good and were deserving premiers winning a closer fought contest, with a final winning margin of 21 points.

The Thirds finished in fifth place with a 8:10 record, performing well but a level below the top four sides. They played a total of 70 players throughout the season which appears to be the nature of Thirds football. 38 of those players played in just 5 games or less!!

The Under 19's were an enthusiastic and, at most times, competitive team but again struggled to win games. They finished with 3 wins for the year, the U19 group were well led by Brendan and Justin Gray and after a couple of worrying seasons, we turned the corner to an extent and created a more positive and engaging environment for our young players which we intend to build on in 2019.




